EXTRA CURRICULAR ELEMENTARY BAND 2017-18 starts in October

Once again, starting, Thursday, Oct 19, two extra-curricular band programs will be offered to all Ladner children taught by experienced Band teachers, Curt Jantzen and Margaret Behenna.

Beginner Band will be offered at the following time/location: Hawthorne Elementary 3:15 - 4:15 p.m. on Thursdays. This Beginner program is mainly for children in Grades 4 & 5 with no previous band experience but any child in Grades 4 and up interested in learning a band instrument can participate.

Advanced Band will be offered at the following time/location Hawthorne Elementary 4:30-5:30 p.m. on Thursdays. The Advanced program is for any student with one year or more of Band experience. The Advanced Band typically has children in Grades 5 - 8 who are looking to further develop their skills and for an enrichment experience in instrumental music.

Tuition for the year is \$295 payable to Hawthorne Elementary on or before the first class.



PARKING REMINDERS & TRAFFIC REPORT

Thank you to our wonderful school opener/crossing guard (on River Road), Dal, as well as our grade 7 volunteers on Admiral Blvd. for all of their efforts to keep us safe.

This is a gentle reminder that as the mornings grow darker, and the weather gets wetter, please use extra caution and slow down on your way to the school. Students are expected to dress appropriately for all weather at recess and lunch hour and should be able to walk safely to school.



Our local Delta Police constables have visited and noticed that there were cars parked in No Parking zones. This is especially unsafe close to the crosswalk where visibility is even more important.

We would also like to remind parents that the school parking lot is for Staff Only. This includes drop-offs before and after school. Please use the pullouts on Admiral Blvd. and students can walk in.

Emergency Release Drill September 29th @2pm

Please make sure that your emergency contact info is correct on ParentConnect

In order to practice for a real emergency, we will be holding our Emergency Release Day on September 29th at 2:00pm. Students will evacuate the school as if a real emergency has happened and gather on the playing field to practice a full release to parents/guardians, just as if there was an actual emergency/natural disaster.

(If the weather is poor, we will muster students in the gym for the release)

This can be a stressful process for students and parents and we will do our best to ensure an orderly and organized process.

Please make sure that you have signed onto Parent Connect and filled out all of the forms and emergency contact information to update each student's information for this school year. We can not release a student to an adult that is not listed as an emergency contact (so the student will have to wait until 3pm dismissal).

This is a good time to go over your Family Emergency Preparedness Plan and discuss - who would be available to pick up my child? If you know that you would not be available during a real emergency, perhaps you should have a plan for a nearby friend/relative to be an emergency contact.

The Story Behind Orange Shirt Day

"I went to the Mission for one year. I had just turned 6 years old. We never had very much money, and there was no welfare, but somehow my granny managed to buy me a new outfit to go to the Mission School in. I remember going to Robinson's store and picking out a shiny orange shirt. It had eyelets and lace, and I felt so pretty in that shirt and excited to be going to school! Of course, when I got to the Mission, they stripped me, and took away my clothes, including the orange shirt. I never saw it again, except on other kids. I didn't understand why they wouldn't give it back to me, it was mine! Since then the colour orange has always reminded me of that and how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and how I felt like I was worth nothing." -Phyllis (Jack) Webstad, Dog
